International Languages Week, 14 - 20 August 2011 Grants for Japan related activities and events

The Sasakawa Fellowship Fund is again offering grants to help support Japan related initiatives for International Languages Week

Details are as follows:

What?

Up to 10 x up to \$150 grants

Who for?

Schools and related bodies which are planning Japan related activities/events to celebrate ILW and promote language learning in their community.

To qualify for the grant, activities must be targeting students across the school or the broader community, not just confined to the Japanese language classroom. So activities which reward those who have already chosen Japanese, while important, would not be considered appropriate for this particular grant.

Activities eligible for this grant are those which might serve to entice interest from students who are not taking Japanese but still could choose to do so. For example some secondary schools send their students to contributing intermediates (or invite intermediates to visit) to run competitions, teach origami, make sushi, demonstrate taiko or kendo etc. Many schools run international food stalls, selling sushi, okonomiyaki, rice balls etc. On its own this would not be approved for the grant, but some schools added value to the food stall idea by running eg sushi making workshops for anyone interested, teaching some basic Japanese at the same time, running related competitions with Japanese knickknack prizes etc.

Please note also that if your application is approved, but you subsequently need to change the activities you are running, it is important to let us know as approval is given based on the proposed activities.
