

## CHRISTCHURCH JAPANESE IMMERSION AFTERNOON 2009 REPORT

This year the Senior Japanese Christchurch Area Immersion Afternoon was held in the Big Room at Christchurch Boys' High School. Because the event was unable to be held in 2008, it was open to both Year 12 and 13 students, although it is primarily designed for Year 12 students.

Ninety three students registered for the event, the very large majority of these being Year 12 students. Several students however, mostly because of illness, did not attend; however we catered and planned for 93. The following schools were represented:- Papanui High School, Rangi Ruru Girls' School, Ashburton College, Christchurch Boys' High School, St Andrew's College, Kaiapoi High School, Ellesmere College, Cashmere High School and St Margaret's College.
